

#### **DSF Mission Statement**

In covenant with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and in cooperation with ecumenical and educational partners, Disciples Seminary Foundation serves God through the formation and support of emerging theological leaders for diverse Christian communities.

Disciples Seminary Foundation supports the preparation of individuals for leadership in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and/or the United Church of Christ, educating some for professional ministry and others for teaching and research in religion. Since its founding in 1960, DSF has maintained a tradition of social and academic connections that can contribute to each student's personal and professional development.

DSF scholarship recipients are selected by the Education Committee of DSF in consultation with the President based on the criteria listed below. The person must be admitted to a graduate degree program at one of DSF partner schools or affiliate institutions<sup>i</sup>. DSF works closely with its partners regarding admissions, financial aid, academic policies, and other related concerns.

# DSF scholarships are governed by its General Scholarship Policy. DSF scholarship recipients are selected based on the following criteria:

- 1. The applicant must be admitted to a graduate degree program at one of the DSF partner schools or affiliate institutions.
- 2. The applicant must be affiliated with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) or the United Church of Christ.

### Once awarded, a DSF scholarship student must:

- a) Achieve and maintain the status of "student in good standing" at the partner school and make satisfactory academic progress toward the fulfillment of degree requirements
- b) Participate in the life of the church through events and/or activities supported by the DSF community, a local Disciples/UCC congregation, region/conference, and/or general/national church expression
